The Great Fire of London Year 2 2022 - 2023 Autumn 1

Science

Our topic this half term is: *Everyday materials*. Every week we will be planning, predicting, conducting and evaluating material investigations, such as: "What would be the most suitable material for Traction Man's cape?" There will be lots of opportunities for practical lessons throughout the half term.

Art

Our topic this half term is 'Human Form'. This term we will learn:

- That a self-portrait means to make a drawing or painting of my own face.
- That collage means to make a piece of artwork from a collection of materials or objects.

We will also study the artists: Julian Opie, Edwina Bridgeman and Damian Hirst.

R.E.

Our topic this half term is: **Beginnings**. During this topics we will learn to know and understand:

- The many beginnings each day offers.
- That God is present in every beginning.
- The signs and symbols of Baptism.
- Acquire the skills of assimilation,

Maths

Along with daily fluent in 5 fluency sessions and flashback four questions (recap previously learnt skills), this half term we will be exploring Number, more specifically Place Value and Calculations. We will become fluent and explore reasoning and problem solving activities. Some of the objectives that we will be coving include:

- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words and recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number (tens, ones).
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = signs.
- Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward.
- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts.
- Add and subtract numbers including: a two-digit number and ones; a two-digit number and tens; two two-digit numbers; adding three one-digit numbers.

English

Writing

This half term, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling will be taught via the Read, Write Inc. phonics scheme every day. In addition to these skills, children will focus on a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts linked to our topic The Great Fire of London. We will be focusing on sequencing and re-tell, wanted posters, letters and poetry. To continue improving our writing, we will be using lots of Kagan techniques and having grammar focus' in our written work.

Reading

Children in Year 2 will continue to participate in the Read, Write inc. Phonics programme. This will take place daily. Children will continue to learn to read fluently and at speed so they can focus on developing their skills in comprehension, vocabulary and spelling.

History/Geography

We will be focusing on the history of the Great Fire of London, comparing London in 1666 to now and developing our map work skills to find where London and the other capital cities in the United Kingdom are. We will be looking at the life of Samuel Pepys, a very significant person during this period and discussing real life superheroes, the fire brigade. We will be understanding how important these heroes are in our daily lives and how the Great Fire of London would have been different if firefighters were around then. As part of our topic we will also visit Rochdale Fire Museum.

Music

We will continue to be taught by Rochdale Music Services this term.
