Today marks the start of Lent and the children from Year Two upwards have been to Mass this morning and received ashes to mark Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time when we often think to give something up or to leave something behind. As a Catholic school, we think about raising money for charities and marking Lent with awareness days. We will also be decorating our new woodland area with painted pebbles, thinking about what we are leaving behind for Lent. Today, your child will bring a St Joseph's Penny Donation Box home. This is one of our special charities, as the 'home' charity for Salford Diocese, and one we have supported over the years.

St Joseph's Lenten Appeal

To fund the work of the Catholic Children's Rescue Society (now Caritas Diocese of Salford), a Lenten collection began in 1904 known as the St Joseph's Penny. The first collection raised 55,217 pennies or just over £230! The idea was that children in the Diocese would raise money for other children and the idea of children helping children has continued to this day. Many parents and grandparents will recall the appeals involving Penny Boxes and even prick cards (see image to right).

Today Caritas Diocese of Salford confronts and fights poverty, inequality and injustice, in which all people, particularly those experiencing disadvantage or discrimination, are welcomed, valued and supported to reach their full potential. Caritas continues to help children and families, alongside services that combat homelessness, build stronger communities, befriend older and isolated people and welcome refugees. They help people of all religions and none.

CAFOD Big Lent Walk

As in previous years, we will also be carrying out other fundraising activities, such as a Big Lent Walk for CAFOD, where children will walk 200 miles during Lent break and lunch times as a way to symbolise Jesus' journey through Lent and the wilderness. To raise money for this, the children in every class will be given the opportunity to make a badge for Lent that they can wear every day to school for a donation of 50p. We will also hold a cake sale next half term as well.

Opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation

On Saturday evening before Mass at Our Lady's, Father Tadgh provides the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We would encourage you to take your child (if they have made their Holy Communion) to receive the Sacrament during Lent as a way of preparation for the season of Easter. Father is usually available in the Lady Chapel from 4:15 onwards.
