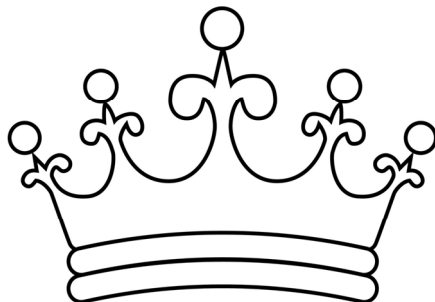

## Sticky Knowledge Vocabulary

Artefact — an object from the past

Bakery — a shop that sells bread and cakes

Change - becoming different

Chronology — the order that things happen

Diary — a personal record that someone writes

History — the study of the past

## Sticky Knowledge Vocabulary

Historian — someone who studies history

House — a building where someone lives

Past - a time that has already happened

Significant — important

Source - something that gives you information about the past eg diary, photograph, books

Timeline — a way of showing the order of events
