

Science

This term, we will be looking at reversible and irreversible changes.

Children will be looking at how dissolving happens, how materials can be separated & irreversible changes such as burning & reacting with acid.

We will continue to work on handwriting and use of more sophisticated punctuation as well as audience and purpose for writing, choosing vocabulary for effect. Our work will focus on the stories of Oliver Twist and Street Child both set in Victorian Britain. These will provide stimulus for writing in role and empathising with Victorian children and their stories.

We will hone our historical enquiry skills by finding out what the local area was like during the Victorian era. We will conduct some fieldwork to discover older buildings in the area, learn about the Cooperative Movement and the suffragettes.
